Brennan's Geography professor explained GIS and how competitive it is. Brennan was able to combine her other interest of drawing and art into mapping to make it even more visually appealing. "I knew this was the field I wanted to pursue," said Brennan. "I am a perfectionist so mapping was challenging and fulfilling at the same time. It is interesting that each map that ever existed in the world has a fingerprint of the author. Mapping is subjective and it's a challenge to find the right patterns and colors that will make the map appealing. I love that each map I create has my artistic reflection within it."

Brennan's less traveled road includes outside-of-the-box ideas to help other landmen benefit from TotaLand. Recently, Brennan introduced the "Freedom Campaign" of buying out software contracts from others not using TotaLand.
